Christos Dimas is the Deputy Minister of Development and Investments, in charge of Research and Innovation; he is a lawyer and a Member of the Hellenic Parliament for the constituency of Korinthia, elected with the “Nea Demokratia” party. Before entering politics, he was employed in the private sector as a business consultant in The Boston Consulting Group (BCG). He was born on the 29th of May 1980. Christos holds degrees from the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA) Law School and from Queen Mary University of London. He completed his Master’s Degree in Comparative Politics at the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE). He obtained a PhD in European Political Economy at the LSE as a beneficiary of the Onassis Public Benefit Foundation Scholarship Program. During his studies, he worked as the London correspondent of “Apogevmatini” newspaper and practiced journalism at the BBC. At the age of 25 he was a teaching assistant at the LSE. He has also taught at the University of Leicester ICON College and was employed as a research fellow at the Jean Monnet European Centre of Excellence. Christos was first elected Member of Parliament in the constituency of Korinthia with “Nea Demokratia” at the May 2012 general elections and was reelected in the 2015 and 2019 elections. In his spare time he enjoys playing football and basketball and is an avid history book reader. He is married to Nikoleta Syrengela and has two children, a daughter and a son.
