

Maximos Senetakis was born on July 17, 1976 in Heraklion, Crete, where he grew up.

He graduated from the Department of Civil Engineering of the National Technical University of Athens. He practiced his profession as an executive of construction companies, associating his name with important projects of the Regional Unit of Heraklion. He is an elected member of the Delegation of the Technical Chamber of Eastern Crete and a member of the Association of Civil Engineers, while he participates in the permanent scientific committee "Development Projects" of the Technical Chamber of Heraklion.

He was elected MP in the elections of May 2012, as well as in the next election on 17 June of the same year. During his first parliamentary term he was elected Secretary of the Presidium of the House and was appointed member of the Research and Technology Committee and the Committee on Educational Affairs.

In the July 2019 elections he was re-elected MP. He was appointed a member of the Committee on Foreign Affairs and Defence, as well as on the Committee on Production and Trade.

In the elections of 21 May 2023 he was elected for the fourth time MP, as in the next election on 25 June of the same year.

Since June 27, he has assumed the duties of Deputy Minister of Development, with responsibility for Research, Technology and Innovation.

Maximos Senetakis is married to the architect engineer Kostantza Schizaki with whom he has two sons, George and Kostis.
