

### Basic principles

- JRC does not take part in competitive bidding
  - JRC does not take part in any applying consortium, and does not take part in the preparation of proposals by any applicant
- Where indicated in the work programme (WP), JRC may participate in actions
- JRC funds its activities in collaborative projects with consortia from its own budget





## Three scenarios for JRC's involvement in HE actions

- JRC as beneficiary
   requesting zero funding –
   collaborating via acceding
   grant agreement
- JRC as associated
   partner collaborating via
   signing the consortium
   agreement (not acceding
   grant agreement)

 JRC as non-beneficiary – in situations when the JRC is not mentioned in the topic at all (collaboration, e.g., via signing a collaboration agreement, or membership in the scientific advisory board, etc.)

#### In practice – JRC as beneficiary/associated partner



JRC may not participate in drafting the project proposal. But if the applicants are interested, they can envisage in their proposal the JRC's potential contribution based on the information provided in the scope of the topic text.



If that information in the topic text is insufficient, the applicant may search for additional publically available information on the JRC's website (<u>EU Science Hub homepage (europa.eu)</u>), on the NCP portal, or request specific information from the JRC (<u>JRC-NCP-Network@ec.europa.eu</u>)



JRC must assure that all the other applicants receive the same information on the JRC's possible contribution to the project (e.g. via the FAQs under the Funding and Tenders Portal).



#### In practice - JRC as beneficiary/associated partner



Once the proposal is selected for funding, only then the JRC and the winning consortia can enter into a deeper discussion on the specific terms of the JRC's participation in the project.



If an agreement is found, the JRC may accede to the grant agreement as a beneficiary requesting zero funding or as an associated partner and become a member of the consortium.



#### In practice – JRC as non-beneficiary




In all those topics, in which the JRC is not mentioned at all the *JRC may collaborate* with the consortia selected for funding as a **non-beneficiary** (without participating in the grant agreement).

 One example of such collaboration is when the JRC would join the project's Scientific Advisory Board.



#### EXCEPTION – Marie Sklodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA)

 In MSCA actions in general, JRC is eligible to participate only as associated partner





# The most typical JRC's contribution to HE projects

- JRC can act as an interface between the research activities and regulatory aspects
- JRC can carry out **knowledge management** activities or help ensure that relevant research results are used for policy making, contributing to an effective feedback to EC policies.
- JRC can carry out (<u>but is not limited to</u>) tasks such as: integrating research results and data in databases and maintaining these databases, validating and maintaining models, providing advice, data analytics, etc. The JRC can also provide access to its research infrastructures, information systems, databases and models.
